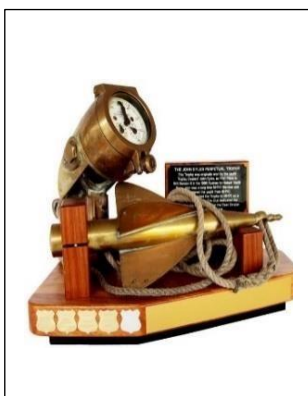
The Premiers Cup

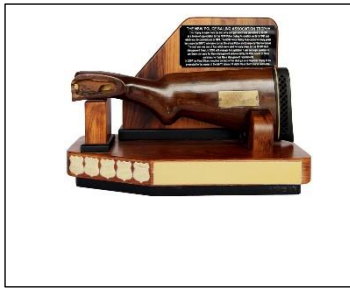
The Asiatic Trust Trophy

This trophy was originally awarded by the Asiatic Trust Company Ltd in 1984 for annual competition in the Sydney to Vanuatu Yacht Race in the I.O.R. Division. The Trophy was first won by Spirit of Vanuatu and again in 1986 by Lindsay Rose - Ruff 'N Tumble at MHYC.

NSW Police Sailing Association Trophy (in memory of Ben Nossiter)

A trophy awarded to the yacht in the Adams 10 Class with the most line honour successes in the Sprint Series.

Part of the shotgun used by the race management team until 1999. When the gun licensing laws changed the Club was forced to surrender their starting shotguns. The Police Sailing Association had a trophy made using one of the butts from one of the shotguns and donated it to Club in appreciation of our close relationship over the years.

It was originally awarded to the winner of the Adams 10 Metre Class short course Pointscore. In 2018, the Sailing Committee rededicated this trophy for the A10 Sprint series in memory of Ben Nossiter.

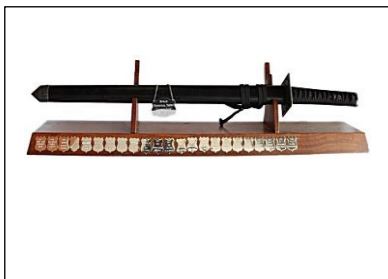


The Rug Up Cup

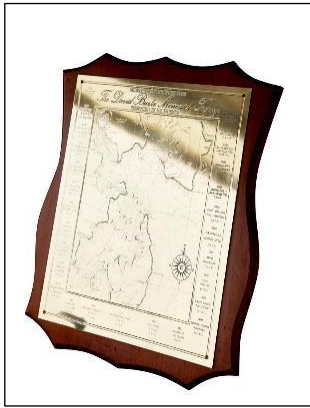
The Nigel Holman Perpetual Trophy

A trophy awarded to the best placed yacht representing MHYC in the annual CYCA, Sydney to Hobart Yacht Race.

Donated by MHYC Members and friends of Nigel Holman in November 2007. Nigel's yacht "Cuckoo's Nest" won the CYCA's Tattersall's Cup for Overall Winner on Corrected Time in the 49th Sydney to Hobart Yacht Race. The 1993 Hobart was one of the toughest races ever in the history of this Blue Water Classic, from a total starting fleet of 104 by race end 67 yachts had pulled out due to the rough conditions.

Seven Island Trophy - November

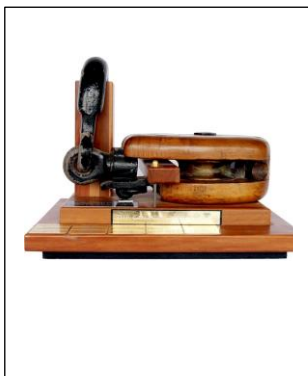

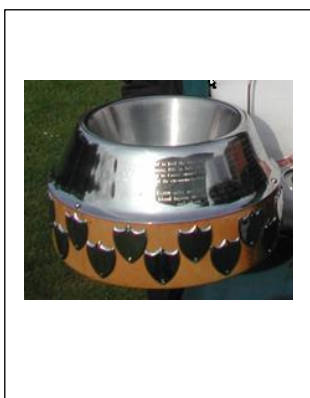
