
CONDUCT OF A RACE

- 25 NOTICE OF RACE, SAILING INSTRUCTIONS AND SIGNALS
- 25.1 The notice of race shall be made available to each boat that enters an event before she enters. The sailing instructions shall be made available to each boat before a race begins.
- 25.2 The meanings of the visual and sound signals stated in Race Signals shall not be changed except under <u>rule 86.1(b)</u>. The meanings of any other signals that may be used shall be stated in the notice of race or sailing instructions.
- 25.3 When the race committee is required to display a flag as a visual signal, it may use a flag or other object of a similar appearance.


- Written Wind, Signals, Starters, OCS, RET, Incidents

Communication

- Visual Signals Flags, Course Board, Axis & Signal Boards
- Sound Signals (RRS26 absence shall be disregarded)
- VHF Radio






Starting a Race - RRS 26


Races shall be started by using the following signals. Times shall be taken from the visual signals; the absence of a sound signal shall be disregarded. Minutes Visual signal Sound Means before signal starting signal One 5 Class flag Warning signal P. I. Z. Z with One Preparatory 4 I, U, or black signal flag Preparatory One long One minute flag removed Class flag One Starting signal removed "or as stated in the notice of race or sailing instructions The warning signal for each succeeding class shall be made with or after the starting signal of the preceding class.










































