# SAILING INSTRUCTIONS

The notation '[DP]' in a rule in the NoR means that the penalty for a breach of that rule may, at the discretion of the protest committee, be less than disqualification.

1	RULES
1.1	The regatta will be governed by the rules as defined in <i>The Racing Rules of Sailing</i> .

1.2 Appendix UF Adams 10 Australian Championships 2025 Edition (Umpired Fleet Races) will apply.

1.3 Class Rule 6.24 (d) is amended to allow the borrowing of sails with the authorisation of the Australian Adams 10 Class Association prior to the first race. Applications can be made via email to adams10association@gmail.com.

#### 2 NOTICES TO COMPETITORS

Notices to competitors will be posted on the official notice board located on the MHYC event webpage.

## 3 CHANGES TO SAILING INSTRUCTIONS

Any change to the sailing instructions will be posted before 0900 on the day it will take effect, except that any change to the schedule of races will be posted by 2000 on the day before it will take effect.

## 4 SIGNALS MADE ASHORE

- 4.1 Signals made ashore will be displayed on the start box flagstaff on the north-eastern corner of MHYC.
- When flag AP is displayed ashore, '1 minute' is replaced with 'not less than 60 minutes' in the race signal AP.

#### 5 SCHEDULE

- 5.1 Registration: Friday 14 February 2025 from 0900hrs to 1000hrs
- 5.2 Equipment Inspection (if required): Friday 14 February 2025 from 0900hrs to 1000hrs
- 5.3 Adams 10 Association AGM: Friday 14 February 2025 from 1000hrs
- 5.4 Competitor Briefing: Friday 14 February 2025 from 1100hrs
- 5.5 Dates of racing:

Friday 14 February 2025: Up to 3 races commencing at 1300hrs Saturday 15 February 2025: Up to 4 races commencing at 1200hrs Sunday 16 February 2025: Up to 3 races commencing at 1150hrs

- 5.6 The scheduled time of the warning signal for the first race is 1255hrs on Friday, 1155hrs on Saturday and 1145hrs on Sunday.
- 5.7 On the last scheduled day of racing no warning signal will be made after 1500hrs.
- To alert boats that a race or sequence of races will begin soon, the orange starting line flag will be displayed with one sound at least five minutes before a warning signal is made.

#### 6 CLASS FLAGS

The Class flag will be the Adams 10 Insignia on a white background.

#### 7 RACING AREAS

Attachment A shows the location of racing areas.

## 8 THE COURSES

- 8.1 The diagrams in Attachment B show the courses, including the approximate angles between legs, the order in which marks are to be passed, and the side to which each mark is to be passed. The approximate course length will be 0.8nm.
- 8.2 The race committee signal vessel may display the approximate compass bearing of the first leg.

#### 9 MARKS

- 9.1 Marks are described in Attachment B.
- 9.2 A race committee vessel signalling a change of a leg of the course is a mark as provided in SI 12.3.

#### 10 AREAS THAT ARE OBSTRUCTIONS

- 10.1 Boats shall pass on the safe water side of the following Cardinal Marks:
  - (a) Gowlland Bombora (Dobroyd Head) All Marks
  - (b) Sow and Pigs Reef- All Marks
  - (c) Shark Island- South and West Marks
- 10.2 Boats shall not sail in the following prohibited areas:
  - (a) The area bounded by imaginary lines projected from the shore and joining the West, South and East Cardinal Marks surrounding Gowlland Bombora.
  - (b) The area bounded by imaginary lines joining the North, East, South and West Cardinal Marks surrounding Sow and Pigs Reef.
- 10.3 For the purpose of RRS 19 and 20, all Cardinal Marks surrounding the Gowlland Bombora and the Sow and Pigs Reef and all imaginary straight lines projected between such marks, shall be deemed obstructions.

# 11 THE START

- 11.1 Races will be started by using RRS 26 with the warning signal made 5 minutes before the starting signal.
- 11.2 The starting line will be between a staff displaying an orange flag on the committee vessel at the starboard end and the course side of the port-end starting mark.
- 11.3 A boat that does not start within 5 minutes after her starting signal will be scored Did Not Start without a hearing. This changes RRS A4 and A5.

# 12 CHANGE OF THE NEXT LEG OF THE COURSE

12.1 To change the next leg of the course, the race committee will lay a new mark (or move the finishing line) and remove the original mark as soon as practicable. When in

- a subsequent change a new mark is replaced, it will be replaced by an original mark.
- 12.2 When Mark 1 is changed, Mark 1a will not be laid.
- 12.3 Except at a gate, boats shall pass between the race committee vessel signalling the change of the next leg and the nearby mark, leaving the mark to port and the race committee vessel to starboard. This changes RRS 28.

#### 13 THE FINISH

13.1 The finishing line will be between a staff displaying a blue flag on the committee boat and the course side of the finishing mark.

## 14 PENALTY SYSTEM

Appendix UF Adams 10 Australian Championships 2025 Edition (Umpired Fleet Races) will apply.

#### 15 TIME LIMITS AND TARGET TIMES

15.1	Race Time Limit	90 mins
	Mark 1 Time Limit	30 mins
	Target Time	40-50 mins
	Finish Window	15 mins

If no boat has passed Mark 1 within the Mark 1 time limit the race will be abandoned. Failure to meet the target time will not be grounds for redress. This changes RRS 62.1(a).

15.2 Boats failing to finish within 15 minutes after the first boat sails the course and finishes will be scored Did Not Finish without a hearing. This changes RRS 35, A4 and A5.

# 16 PROTESTS AND REQUESTS FOR REDRESS

- 16.1 Protest forms are available at the race office located at MHYC Reception. Protests and requests for redress or reopening shall be delivered there within the appropriate time limit.
- The protest time limit is 90 minutes after the last boat has finished the last race of the day or the race committee signals no more racing today, whichever is later.
- Notices will be posted no later than 30 minutes after the protest time limit to inform competitors of hearings in which they are parties or named as witnesses. Hearings will be held in the protest room, located at MHYC, beginning at the time posted.
- Notices of protests by the race committee, technical committee or protest committee will be posted to inform boats under RRS 62.
- 16.5 Breaches of SIs, 18, 21, 22, 23, 24, 25, 26 and 27 will not be grounds for a protest by a boat. This changes RRS 60.
- 16.6 On the last scheduled day of racing a request for redress based on a protest committee decision shall be delivered no later than 30 minutes after the decision was posted. This changes RRS 61.

#### 17 SCORING

- 17.1 The Low Point scoring system, RRS Appendix A2, will apply.
- 17.2 3 races are required to be completed to constitute a series.
- 17.3 When fewer than 6 races have been completed, a boat's series score will be the total of her race scores.
- 17.4 When 6 or more races have been completed, a boat's series score will be the total of her race scores excluding her worst score.

#### 18 SAFETY REGULATIONS

- 18.1 Boats intending to race shall report to the committee vessel prior to their first warning signal, on starboard tack, with mainsail hoisted, to confirm their intention to race.
- 18.2 Boats that cannot be identified may be scored 'DNC'. [DP]
- 18.3 A boat that retires from a race shall notify the race committee as soon as possible. (DP)
- 18.4 All boats shall monitor the race management channel VHF 72. [DP]

#### 19 REPLACEMENT OF CREW OR EQUIPMENT

- 19.1 Substitution of competitors will not be allowed without prior written approval of the race committee. [DP]
- 19.2 Substitution of damaged or lost equipment will not be allowed unless authorized by the race committee. Requests for substitution shall be made to the committee at the first reasonable opportunity. [DP]

#### 20 EQUIPMENT AND MEASUREMENT CHECKS

On the water, a boat can be instructed by a member of the race committee or the technical committee to proceed immediately to a designated area for inspection. Ashore, equipment may be inspected or measured at any at the discretion of the race committee.

#### 21 EVENT ADVERTISING

Boats may be required to display event advertising supplied by the organising authority. If this rule is broken, World Sailing Regulation 20.9.2 applies. [DP]

#### 22 OFFICIAL BOATS

Official boats may display the MHYC burgee.

#### 23 TRASH DISPOSAL

Trash may be placed aboard support or official boats.

#### 24 HAUL-OUT RESTRICTIONS

Keelboats shall not be hauled out during the regatta except with and according to the terms of prior written permission of the race committee. [DP]

#### 25 DIVING EQUIPMENT AND PLASTIC POOLS

Underwater breathing apparatus shall not be used around keelboats and boat bags shall remain open between the preparatory signal of the first race and the end of the regatta. [DP]

#### 26 RADIO COMMUNICATION

Except in an emergency, a boat that is racing shall not make voice or data transmissions and shall not receive voice or data communication that is not available to all boats. [DP]

#### 27 PRIZES

Prizes will be given as follows:

- a) One Design First Place (perpetual trophy)
- b) One Design Second & Third Places
- c) PHS Handicap First Place
- d) Corinthian Trophy First Place (only boats with all non-professional crew members may be considered for the award. Skippers must sign a declaration to be eligible)

- e) Masters Trophy First Place (best placed boat on One Design with an average age of skipper and crew over 50 years)
- f) Wooden Seat First Place (perpetual trophy)
- g) Additional prizes may be awarded at the discretion of the Organising Authority

# 28 DISCLAIMER OF LIABILITY

Competitors participate in the regatta entirely at their own risk. See RRS 3, Decision to Race. The organizing authority will not accept any liability for material damage or personal injury or death sustained in conjunction with or prior to, during, or after the regatta.

# 29 MEDIA RIGHTS


Participants automatically grant to the Organising Authority and the series sponsors of the Event, the right in perpetuity to make use and show from time to time and at their discretion, any motion pictures, still pictures and live, taped or film television and other reproductions of them during the period in which they participate, and in all material related to the series without compensation.

# 30 INSURANCE

Each participating boat shall be insured with valid third-party liability insurance with a minimum cover of \$10 Million per incident or the equivalent.


# Attachment A - Racing Area

The racing area is primarily The Sound but may include Obelisk Bay, Watsons Bay, North Harbour, Hunters Bay and other sections of Sydney Harbour to enable racing in a variety of wind conditions and directions.

1	Start - 1 - 1a -Finish
2	Start – 1 – 1a – Gate 2s/2p – 1 – 1a –Finish
3	Start – 1 – 1a – Gate 2s/2p – 1 – 1a – Gate 2s/2p – 1 – 1a –Finish

# Note:

- The course to be sailed will be displayed on a Course Board on the CV and may be preceded by the letter 'W', to indicate the number of roundings of the Windward Mark/s.
- The bearing to the first Mark from the Start may be displayed prior to or with the Warning Signal.
- The Gate will be laid approx. 50-100m to windward of the Start Line and may be laid after the starting signal.
- If only one Gate Mark is laid, all boats shall round that Mark to Port.
- Mark la (offset) may or may not be laid.
- When Mark 1 is changed, Mark 1a will not be laid.
