Valid protest!

Facts Found

- Plum Crazy sailing on starboard
- Tensixty sailing on port
- Both boats windward in 10-15kn
- Tensixty attempted to pass behind and to leeward of Plum Crazy
- Plum Crazy hailed "starboard" on more than one occasion, but were unable to avoid contact once they realised that Tensixty was unable to keep clear.
- Tensixty was unable to bear away sufficiently and collided with plum crazy on the rear port quarter, causing significant damage (hull penetration) and injury (right elbow of Plum Crazy helm)
- Both Plum Crazy and Tensixty retired

Conclusion

- Tensixty on port failed to keep clear of Plum Crazy on Starboard, breaking rule 10
- Tensixty failed to avoid contact with Plum Crazy, breaking rule 14
- It was not reasonably possible for Plum Crazy to avoid contact with Tensixty, thus they did not break rule 14.

Decision

- The protest is upheld.
- Tensixty retired from the race, as required by 44.1(b). No further penalty
